FROM THE DEPUTY ENGINEER

Our crews have been working on culvert replacements, extensions, and shoulder repairs and trying to stay ahead of the upcoming paving project on Finefrock and CR 185. We still have a couple of cross overs to replace and one area where we will be improving the shoulders. The work completed so far looks great!!!

We are scheduled to meet with M & B Asphalt, Co. this coming Tuesday, July 12th for a pre-construction meeting. We will get a better idea of their schedule for our paving project. Roads that M & B Asphalt, Co. will be paving are: Finefrock, CR 181, CR 185, Limerick, and Maple.

In the office we've been staying busy with OPWC applications and several ditch petition projects. We are in the process of finalizing The Guy Fisher Ditch Petition so we can file it with the Commissioners and schedule a final hearing. Survey crew finalized the survey for the Michael's petition and Dean is now reducing the notes. The drainage crew put together yet another petition for a property owner. The name of the potential new petition is: The Kiser Ditch that runs in the vicinity of CR 12 and CR 41.

FROM THE ROAD SUPERINTENDENT

Four new employees have been hired for the road crew. Matt Wonderley, Austin Gill, Travis Arter, and Nick Collins will be starting on July 18th. Please help them out getting acquainted with our facilities.

The CR 175 and CR 294 culvert replacement is now complete. Unilliance did all the excavation, installation of the pipe, and clean up. Cody, Jenna, and Lee hauled all the stone, spoils, and black top for the job. Multiple tile breaks finally prompted the replacement of the 24" tile.

Two of the three areas that needed tile extensions and shoulder work on CR 185 are now complete. Crews have started on the third area today. Again the dirt for the shoulder will be coming from the Ally Ditch.

ROAD MAINTENANCE

- An 18" culvert was replaced this week on Finefrock Rd.
- The excavator has moved over to the fairgrounds parking lot where we will be digging out a couple of new drives. The dirt will then be used in the fairgrounds along the new pavement.
- Two catch basins were raised in the fairgrounds.
- Mowing continues on the east side of the county. Also, Eddie is out on the east side with the boom mower.
- Pot holes were filled on CR 175 and on CR 198.
- Areas around town were mowed.
